Next, a friend asked if I would reprint her book on Sabians. It's the best book on the Sabians, better than Jones or Rudhyar.

At this point - midsummer - I shifted from reprinting highly specialized books, to overlooked classics. When times are good we expand outwards, searching for details. When times are hard, we want good, clear, solid books.

First up, Margaret Hone's Modern Text-Book of Astrology. The best text-book ever written, which has taught thousands the fundamentals. Next, I grabbed Robson's Beginner's Guide to Astrology. I had not previously seen it. I quickly went on to his Student's Text-Book, which, to my amazement, was one of the finest astrology books I have ever seen. Publication was delayed while I looked for his picture, which cannot be had. Instead, I found his biography.

Next came Sepharial's Manual of Astrology, a late edition with added material from other hands. That was followed by a paperback reprint of Cornell's Encyclopaedia of Medical Astrology with a new, lower price. Then came two by Alan Leo: The Key to Your Own Nativity, and, just out, Alan Leo's Dictionary of Astrology. In a month or two I will publish my own book of essays. 2010 was a good year for books!



**THE** obstruction of Saturn is some times derived from the self, as for instance in personal indolence or stupidity. It is also very frequently the result of actions for which the subject is in no way responsible & over which he has little or no control. These actions are often those of older people (e.g., the parents) or of those who are in authority over him, as the government. For example, some new law or other change in the social organism may interfere with his business or other enterprises.

He [Saturn] represents the ultimate expression of the thoughts of God in the mundane spheres of precipitated existence, because these are the most definite & limited of all things. Hence he is pre-eminently the *practical* planet.

He has, indeed, a value anterior to the mundane world, for through Aquarius he is a thinker & planner, profound, careful & exact. But it is rarely that a Saturn-value in the horoscope has not a direct external expression in our lives.— Essays on the Foundations of Astrology, 1947

**Notes:** A pale sapphire star situated in the lower part of the Lyre. From Al Waki, the Falling, and known in the Middle Ages as Vulture Cadens, the Falling Gypre or Vulture. Often incorrectly spelt Vega.

Influence: According to Ptolemy it is of the nature of Venus & Mercury. It gives beneficence, ideality, hopefulness, refinement & changeability & makes its natives grave, sober, outwardly pretentious & unusually lascivious.

With Sun: Critical, abrupt, reserved, unpopular, fleeting honours, influential position, insincere friends. If with Mars also, above the earth, and the Moon be with Procyon, death from the bite of a mad dog.



# To Warn or Not To Warn

HERE is a diversity of opinion among astrologers as to whether a person should be told of future disaster threatening in his natal chart. Many believe in free will, holding that being forewarned is being forearmed; some are fatalistic & see no possible evading of the catastrophe, so that it would be only a disservice to worry the person pointlessly; others feel that the knowledge might condition him toward attracting or even precipitating his own disaster, like Job, who cried that the thing he greatly feared had THEREFORE come upon him. This is undeniably a moot point worthy of our deep concern on his behalf.

In the natal chart on the opposite page, we find the Midheaven ill-starred by conjunction to the malefic Pleiades - the socalled "Weeping Sisters" – so that her Fate and other 10th-House affairs would be something to weep about; particularly since the Midheaven is further singled out for attention by exact conjunction to the Sun's Solstice point in 28 Taurus (see page 103). Any angle or planet thus emphasized must be reckoned with in timing events because it is empowered by the Sun & thus has conferred authority to act. In this chart, the Sun rules the 12th House (weeping) & the ruler of the Ascendant is there in bad aspect to the Part of Fortune which, when in Pisces or a Pisces decanate is the Part of Misfortune.

As the Midheaven moves forward at the Sun's rate 0:59' per year & passes over Jupiter & Mars in the 10th House, we still do not expect disaster, because these two are intercepted or held in abeyance & also are not afflicted by bad planetary aspect. . . — Here & There in Astrology, 1961

partial solar eclipse, as the node is 11 degrees away. Visible in an arc from western Mauretania in Africa, up the European Atlantic coast through Scandinavia and then sweeping back down into central Russia before ending in western Mongolia. The very peak seems to be in northern Sweden.

Of this eclipse in the second decanate of Capricorn, **Raphael** wrote,

Causes military riots, and the mutiny of soldiers against their officers.

In his **Dictionary**, Alan Leo wrote,

In the 2nd [decanate], soldiers are excited & animated against their commanders & superiors, and it frustrates all their devices.

As the eclipse peaks in Sweden, and as Sweden has been in the news lately (Wikileaks et al), I read in Campion that Sweden traces its origin to the election of King Gustavus Vasa on June 6, 1523. Setting this chart in old style (careful!) puts Pluto at 14 vs 52. Such setups normally need a trigger. Saturn might do it by square, either in April or August, but remember that I don't do forecasting as I'm lousy at it.

real, or astronomical, as well as spiritual & even physiological symbol, its significance changing with its application. Originally it was a triple-headed serpent, but now it is a rod with two serpents twined around it, the rod of Mercury. It represents the fall of primary matter into the grosser terrestrial. Astronomically, the head & tail represent the points of the ecliptic, where the planets and even the Sun and Moon meet in close embrace. See AARON'S ROD.

Aaron's Rod. ... it is probable that the mystery of the rod or wand is concealed in the ninth sign of the Zodiac [Sagittarius] which governs religion, prophecy, the Guide or Guru, or new birth.



# Saturn in Pisces, or the 12th, or Capricorn on 12

TE all have skeletons in our closets. What makes these people different is that they think their skeletons are worse than anybody else's no bones about it, sometimes they are. But you don't solve anything by jumping down into the bottle of Scotch or taking "blue boys" every night to get to sleep & avoid those lonely, crazy feelings you fear. Nevertheless, that's what these folks often do. Their parents made them feel it was taboo to explore their fears. "Don't be afraid" or even more destabilizing, "You're not really afraid" invalidates the child's feelings. They grow up fearing the irrational. This fear can include analysis, astrology, hypnosis, meditation, counseling and any form of personal introspection. No one taught them how. Often this fear of really testing starts young. The parents talk about you as if you're not there, and you're standing in the middle of the room. The result: these folks sometimes feel so cut off from other people that they wonder if they really exist.

Karma-watchers say this position denotes a fear of prison, hospitals, and any kind of confinement. These children are often pinned down or forced against their will. They don't like closed doors or playpens. It calms them down to know they can escape.

If they're restricted too much in their youth, they'll find normal responsibilities crushing in adulthood; hence the escapist behavior. At its most extreme, they may experience mild feelings of claustrophobia.

These are lonely, lonely souls. Often their faith is shot. What makes matters worse is that they are generally kind people. People come to them, cry on their shoulders, even have nervous breakdowns with them. These kind souls feel as if they are living in the middle of the Emergency Room at Bellevue; suffering moves them deeply. They can't bear to fob people off with platitudes; they feel responsible & roll up their sleeves & give their all. © Debbi Kempton-Smith, 1999

### **Part 20:**

## **Stature**

...but for a more detailed judgment of his peculiarities & defects the following special rules will be found necessary.—

- (a) Stature. Tallness & shortness are very difficult to judge accurately, and the typical stature given by the signs is frequently modified. The chief factors in determining this question are the rising sign, its ruler, the Moon, and the planet in strongest aspect with the Moon or ruler. In general the nativities of Gemini, Leo, Sagittarius and Aquarius are tall, and those of Taurus, Cancer, Capricorn & Pisces are short, the other signs disposing to an average height, but it is not safe to rely too much upon this alone. Some special rules are as follows:
- **1.** Planets aspecting a significator usually give taller bodies when rising than when setting.
- 2. The Moon gives a shorter body when decreasing in light (i.e. passing from the opposition of the Sun to the conjunction) than when increasing (i.e. passing from conjunction to opposition).
- **3.** An earthy sign rising & the Sun, Moon & ruler of the Ascendant in earthy signs gives a very short body. The same is the case if the majority of planets are in earthly signs & aspecting the Moon & Ascendant.
- **4.** If the Moon is in the Ascendant in Pisces & Jupiter is in Cancer, especially in the 6th house, the native will be very short or a dwarf.
- **5.** Capricorn or Aquarius rising, with Mercury & Venus conjunct or opposed Saturn causes a dwarfed body.
- **6.** The Moon & ruler of the Ascendant without latitude & in the ends of signs causes shortness.

## Minerva

**HE** Roman mythology surrounding Minerva closely corresponds to that of the Greek goddess Pallas Athena. In mythology, these goddesses were trained to strategy by their father — both represent "learning strategies" and — learning the strategies required to PLEASE the father. The natal disposition will indicate the demands. Aspects will show whether these were minor modifications (of the personality) or whether it was impossible to "become" a person of whom the father would approve. Beyond childhood, the model of attempting to gain the father's approval & pleasure is extended to other "politics" — in relationship & learning. So, Minerva indicates what is done to gain the approval of others; it does show the ability to "figure out what they want" (and then the aspects tell you whether or not the individual is willing/able to do it, and whether or not the "pleasing others" is gained as some kind of personal cost (again, the aspects will show the "price" of such behaviors & actions). Transits to natal Minerva have coincided with the death of the father.

When retrograde, Minerva indicates anxiety & complications in the relationship with father (and development of defensive, mental strategies). There is an inability to "please" or an unwillingness to do the very thing that is demanded (even if tacitly) by others. The retrograde Minerva often feels that it was unable to modify house, sign or aspects in a way that was acceptable to father/others.
